

Post/Franklin Neighborhood Profile Fact Sheet

Population

- Total population of 3,777 people including 1,338 households.⁵
 - The racial/ethnic composition (based on the head of household) is 61% (821) White, 25% (339) African American, 9% (124) Hispanic, 0.2% (2) Asian, and 4% (52) not reported.⁵
- There are 375 children ages 0-4, 434 children ages 0-5, 620 children ages 0-8.⁵
- A total of 504 family households have kids, and 311 (62%) of these have an unmarried head of household.

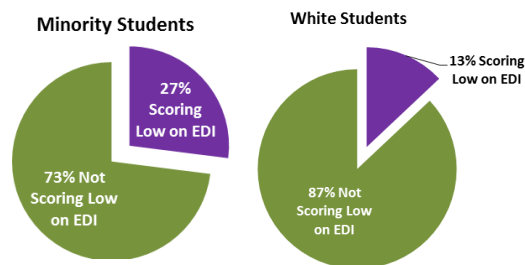
Early Childhood

- There are 3 licensed child care facilities and Head Start Centers¹ to serve the 375 children ages 0-4.

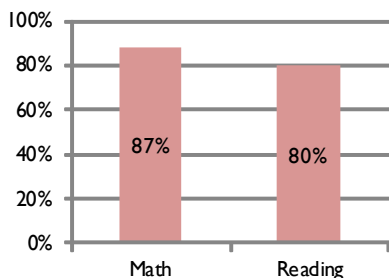
Ready for School

- 20% of kindergarteners scored low on two or more EDI indicators.² This number ranged from 20% - 34% across neighborhoods.
 - 2% of students scored high on 4 or more EDI indicators (in the 90th percentile), meaning they entered kindergarten ready for school.² This number ranged from 0% - 7% across neighborhoods.
- 35% of kindergarteners were not receiving needed school-based support.²

Succeeding by Third Grade

- Enrollment:
 - Post/Franklin has 242 students in K-3rd grade (31% White, 30% African American, 31% Hispanic, 7% other)
- Many of 3rd graders not meeting MEAP standards (see graph to left)³
- 90% of Franklin students eligible for free/reduced lunch⁷

Adult Educational Attainment

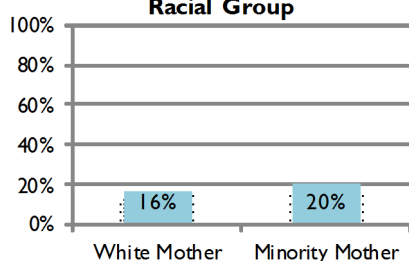
- 36% of adults over age 25 do not have a high school diploma.⁴

Healthy Kids

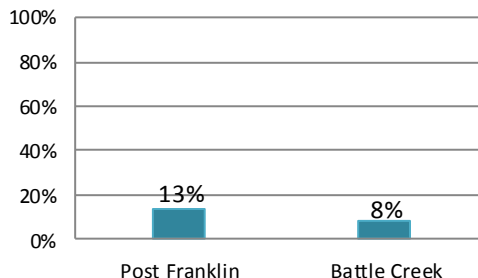
Healthy Births in 2009

- 18% of all births had low prenatal care (fewer than 12 visits; 16% of White mothers, 20% of Minority mothers).⁶
- 52% of all births were to mothers who had less than a 39 week gestation term (58% of White mothers, 44% of all Minority mothers).⁶
- 13% of all newborns were low-weight (below 5.5 pounds).⁶
- 20% of all births were to teen moms under 20 years old (16% of all White mothers, 24% of all Minority mothers).⁶

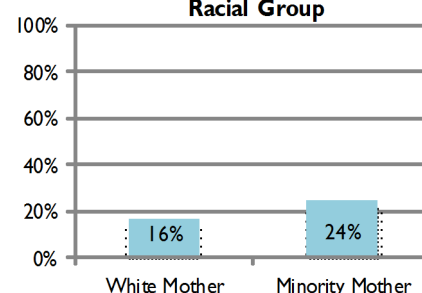
Low Prenatal Care within Racial Group

Births to Teen Moms within Racial Group

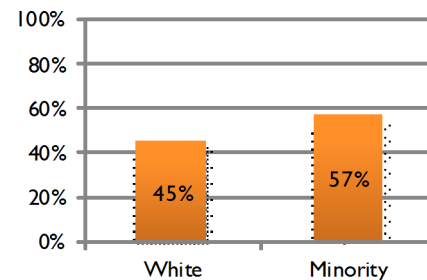


Financially Secure Families

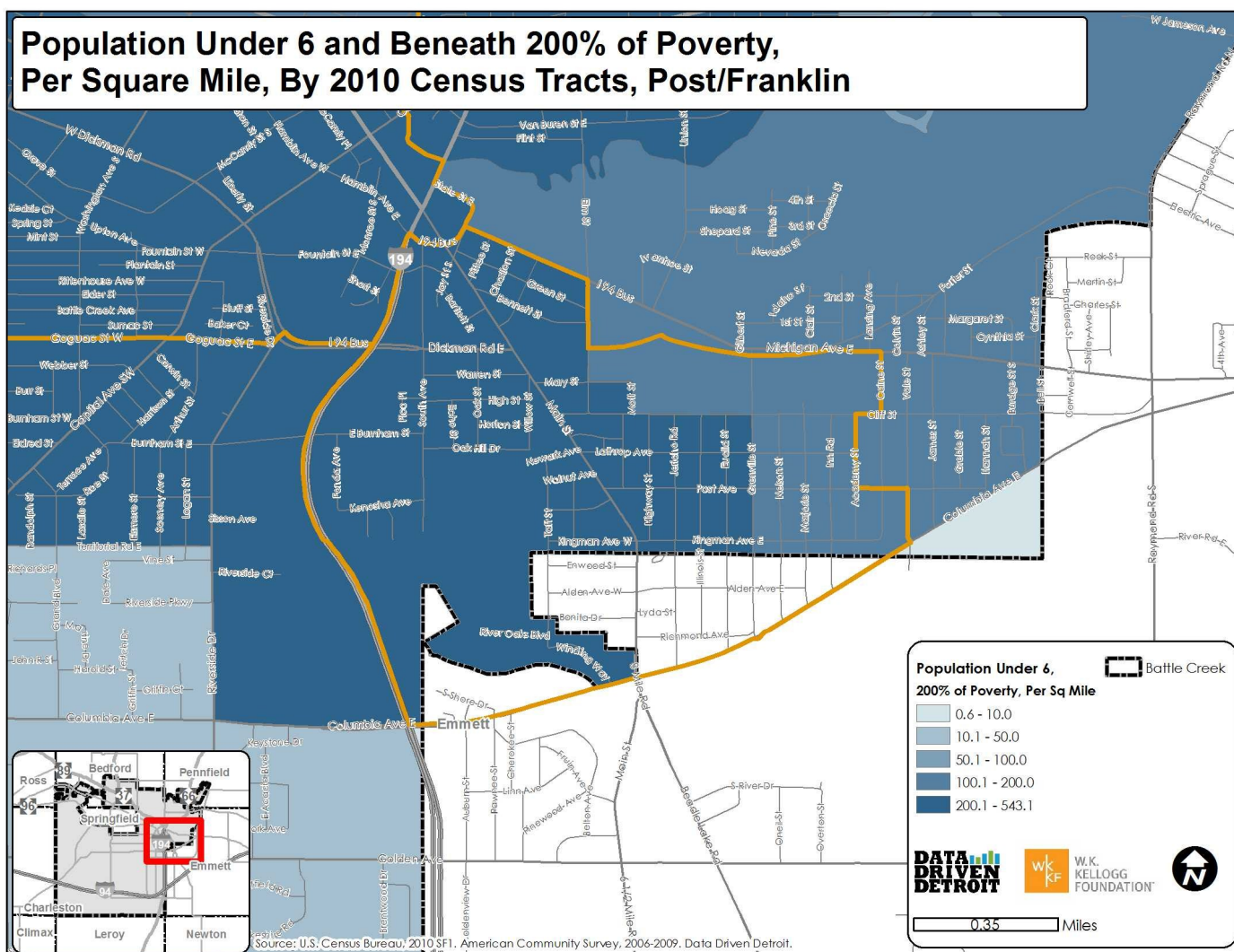
Between 2006 and 2010:

- 57% of Minority individuals and 45% of White individuals lived below 100% poverty.⁴
- 275 families with kids (40%) lived below 100% poverty, and 207 (75%) of these were single parent families.⁴
- 74% of children under 6 years old lived below 100% poverty; 95% lived below 200% poverty⁴
- The unemployment rate was 16% for adults without a High School diploma, 10% for High School graduates, 9% for adults with some college and 29% for college graduates.⁴
